Inquiry Process: In order to see whether Holden might be a good fit for your student, please call or sign up online for one of the options listed below. All tours are virtual due to Covid-19 until further notice.

### **Application Checklist: Applicants are encouraged to apply online at <https://holdenhigh.org/admissions/>**

- Complete and return Application Form. Prospective students should ideally handwrite the answers to the questions. (Ok for students to type as well.)
- Schedule student for a virtual visit day. Student interviews will be held during the visit day. (Students may visit before submitting an application.)
- Submit transcripts and most recent report card, current IEP or 504 plan, and/or learning assessment.
- Fill out and submit a medical release form (if applicable).
- Completed Teacher Recommendation Form. This form should be emailed to [kristinl@holdenhigh.org](mailto:kristinl@holdenhigh.org) or mailed directly to Holden High School Admissions.
- Submit a writing sample from current school year (essay, research paper, creative writing piece). On the writing sample, please include the nature of the assignment. **(If applying for Elective Class Option Program, no writing sample is needed.)**
- Enclose application fee of \$87 or pay online.

Note: Sometimes the admissions committee requests additional interviews or forms to be completed.

### **Tuition**

Tuition for the 2020-21 school year is \$33,434. Tuition for the Elective Option Program is \$935 per month and the Academic Option Program is \$1015 per month. Tuition for the 2021-22 school year is determined at the end of the fall semester by Holden's Board of Trustees.

### **Tuition Reduction**

Holden is committed to economic diversity and strives to assist as many families as possible. Tuition Reduction is available to qualifying families and can substantially offset the cost of tuition. On average, 70% of families receive some amount of tuition reduction. Information to apply for Tuition Reduction is available on our website.
